## WHO, WHOM OR WHOSE?

## **WHO**

- Subject pronoun
- Who went to the movies last weekend?
  "Who" refers here to the verb "went".
- Who <u>has</u> two dogs? Mike has two dogs.
- This is the boy who has two dogs.

## **WHOM**

- Object pronoun
- This is the girl whom I stole the car.

I => subject

stole => verb

whom => is referring to "the girl"; "the girl" received the action.

Whom did I steal the car?

## **WHOSE**

- Possessive pronoun
- In Scotland lived a poor shepherd whose name was James Hogg.

The name of the shepherd was James Hogg. His name was James Hogg.

• Whose umbrella is this? This is Mark's umbrella. This is his umbrella.
