

WHO, WHOM OR WHOSE?

WHO

- Subject pronoun
- *Who went to the movies last weekend?*
“Who” refers here to the verb “went”.
- *Who has two dogs? Mike has two dogs.*
- *This is the boy who has two dogs.*

WHOM

- Object pronoun
- *This is the girl whom I stole the car.*
I => subject
stole => verb
whom => is referring to “the girl”; “the girl” received the action.
- *Whom did I steal the car?*

WHOSE

- Possessive pronoun
- *In Scotland lived a poor shepherd whose name was James Hogg.*
The name of the shepherd was James Hogg.
His name was James Hogg.
- *Whose umbrella is this? This is Mark’s umbrella. This is his umbrella.*
